

**Areas identified as 'Hate to lose' at the consultation event held on
September 29th 2019.**

Specific areas noted	% of responses	Individual comments posted
Open/green spaces	52%	Fields by hotel need to be kept free as now. Keep fields. No development on land between Carlyon Bay and Charlestown. The fields between Sea Road and Charlestown. The fields between Sea Road and the sea. Green spaces close to the Carlyon Bay Hotel. The fields are a huge asset to the area. Keep the fields.
Access to coastal path	22%	Keep the access to coast path and coastal green spaces. Coastal footpath views to be reinstated. Maintain access to coast path and all surrounding green spaces. Don't lose access to the coast path.
Cornish hedges	9%	Hate to lose all trees in Beach Road and the Cornish hedges. Keep the Cornish hedges.
Views of sea/hills/open sky	21%	Mustn't lose the views of hills, sea and open sky. Fantastic views all along the coast path. Crinnis Beach and wide open spaces.
Coast path for views and wildlife	9%	An important habitat for wildlife - plants, insects and animals.
Access to beach	9%	Hate to lose Crinnis Beach and access to all the beaches - Crinnis, Shorthorn and Polgaver.
Tregrehan recreation ground	5%	Hate to lose.
