I was pleased to meet with the Neighbourhood Development Plan steering group in Carlyon Bay to discuss what can be done to get the Carlyon NDP over the line.

The controversial hybrid planning application with elements around Duporth, Charlestown and Charlestown School has been withdrawn by the applicant.
